

Medicine Hat Area Cemeteries

First Reformed Church, Bingville, Alberta.

This church and cemetery are located in an area known as The British Block or the Canadian Army training grounds north of Medicine Hat, Alberta. The legal land description is S 02-18-07-W 4. Travel eighteen miles north on highway #884 then fourteen miles east. Special permission must be obtained from the British Army at Ralston.

Comrey Cemetery, Manyberries

This cemetery is located about fifty six miles south of Medicine Hat, Alberta, on the Black and White Trail and six miles west. The legal land description is SW 14-02-06- W 4 and is west of the Municipal District of Cypress boundary.

Eugene Burton V - T Ranch.

Paul Hestor, a cowboy from the old school worked for many of the large ranches in south eastern Alberta. The last twenty four years of his life were spent working for the Eugene Burton ranch. The ashes of Paul Hester were spread over a selected area of this ranch, he was born at Zephyr, Texas, in 1887 and died November 28, 1962, at Medicine Hat, Alberta. His remains were spread January 12, 1963.

Lutheran Church SE 16-10-04-W4, Alberta.

The remains of a church foundation can still be seen in a pasture at the northeast corner of the above land location.

There is no indication of a cemetery. The site can be found by traveling south on Eagle Butte Road to township road 100, four miles east to range road 43 then three miles north. The church denomination is unknown as at September 06, 1996.

The church located at this site was built in 1914. Most of the German speaking settlers were from a predominately Lutheran Church School background. Research over the past few years in the

southeast corner of Alberta and the southwest corner of Saskatchewan indicate there are numerous burials besides those in the registered cemetery plots. The following are interred somewhere in this general area:
