

Tobler Family Cemetery, Gascoigne, Saskatchewan.

Eight burials have taken place at this well maintained plot, it is enclosed with a single chain attached to painted two inch steel posts. A stone monument has been placed to preserve the memory of the pioneers interred here. The plot is located in the southwest corner of SE 30-20-27- W3, four miles south and three miles west of Mendham, Saskatchewan. The land for this cemetery was probably donated by Andrew Tobler, as he homesteaded this piece of property. Site visit June 02, 1997. There are no individual grave markers.

The following are interred here:

Baron male infant.

Stickle Regina.

Steciw infant daughter of Anton Steciw and Anna Janyk.

Tobler Andreas born September 26, 1863, died April 21, 1927.

Tobler Rose.

Tobler Emanuel.

Tobler female infant.

Tobler male infant.

Gascoigne, Saskatchewan, Cemetery.

This well fenced one acre plot is about 200 yards west of the north/south highway five miles east and four and one half miles north of Burstall, Saskatchewan. The small town that was located here has vanished completely, there is no indication that it existed except for this cemetery. As at September 02, 1996 we could only find one marked grave but assume that other burials occurred here. Legal land description is NE 27-20-28-W3.

The single marked grave is that of Emil Bauer, we could not read the dates.

We assume the following to be interred here:

Hausauer Elizabeth born February 15, 1911 died March 14, 1914, of George Hausauer and Wilhelmina Tippe.

Tippe Adam born March 21, 1852 died November 16, 1918, father of Jacob Tippe.
