Hatton, Saskatchewan Cemetery.

As at October 12, 1996, half the fence surrounding this plot has been removed, the grass has not been cut in years. There is evidence of numerous burials at this site but only six markers are evident. The cemetery is located just south of the railway track on Hatton Road. Legal land description is NE 36-12-29-W3. Information from markers follows.

Allen George Wilbert 44 years, 5 months, died May 14, 1915, husband of Hulda C. Allen.

Cameron Susan born October 19, 1877 died May 11, 1927.

Hoffman Emanuel born January 20, 1902, in the United States died May 05, 1932, of Anton Hoffman and Maria Wedrich.

Lamont Mrs. wife of Thomas Lamont.

Mitchell McLeay Arthur Franklin born April 11, 1913, died October 18, 1915, when car hit by train at the east Hatton crossing, of James P. and Florence Mitchell.

Stahl nee Fischer Annie born 1908, died 1930, of John and Wilhelmina Fischer, wife of Alfred Stahl.

Stahl Anna born 1884, died 1930, of Mr. and Mrs. Christian Stahl. "Our dear sister has gone on before to greet us on the blessed shore."

Stahl Mathilda born 1876, died 1948, of Mr. and Mrs. Christian Stahl.

Terry Mr. died from influenza in 1918.

Willis infant daughter of Floyd Willis and ? Love.

Wilson Robert 7 years, 6 months, of Jimmie Moffat Wilson and Agnes McCreadie.

Zahner nee Loch born 1889, in Germany, died fall 1948.

From other sources:

Hoover Elizabeth died December 25, 1918, wife of Hampton Hoover.

Newheim Lutheran Church and Cemetery, Hatton, Saskatchewan. SE 26-10-30-W3.

The land for this church and cemetery was donated by William Guenther. The building was erected prior to 1915 with regular services held until about 1952 when the congregation joined with the church at Irvine, Alberta.

Pastor Bietsch served from January 1918 until February 1923, other pastors that served were the Reverends Brokopp, Oberhammer, Scheffler, G. Daechsel, Mantz, M. Voss and Senft.

The cemetery is enclosed by a five strand barbed wire fence on steel posts, vegetation is kept trimmed by descendants of the persons interred here. The plot can be found by traveling eight miles south on the Meridian Road at the Alberta-Saskatchewan border, one mile east then one mile north through a cultivated field.

There are eight grave markers, mostly inside small wrought iron fences, most are in good condition. As at April 08, 1997.

Eiserman nee Adams Ida born April 29, 1866, died August 20, 1941, from Neuritis (Nerven Leiden) interred August 22, 1941, wife of Adolph Eiserman.

Zeeb Johann born September 14, 1908, died January 26, 1928, from appendicitis (Blinddarm Entzündung), interred January 29, 1928. Marker is a small concrete cross.

Zieffle nee Schuler Dorothea born 1877, died 1933, wife of Gottlieb Zieffle. Inside low metal fence.

Hoffman nee Nickolous Charlotte born September 24, 1880, at Rorhbach, Russia, died May 17, 1939, from asthma, interred May 21, 1939, wife of Henry Hoffman born December 23, 1881, at Neyglestahl,

Russia, died May 11, 1966, at Medicine Hat, Alberta, of August Hoffman and Rose Bollinger. Inside iron fence.

Laye Cemetery Hatton, Saskatchewan. SW corner of SE 06-11-29-W3.

The Laye Cemetery can be reached by traveling eight miles south on the Meridian Road at the Alberta-Saskatchewan border then two miles east. Legal land description is SE 06-11-29-03.

We traveled to the location April 09, 1997, and were able to find the spot with help from Mr. Hoffman who lives two miles south east of the cemetery. A prairie trail through Mr. Hoffman's property winds north and west to the small cemetery.

This neglected cemetery lies in the middle of a pasture, the plot is surrounded by a very good three wire fence. The only marker at this location is a small cross made from two pieces of ancient machinery flat iron that was bolted together.

There are no grave stones.

Flemmer nee Hottmann Dorothea died 1940, wife of Jacob Flemmer born November 10, 1868, at Glueckstal, Russia, died April 22, 1954, interred Hillside Cemetery.

Laye Adolph killed by lightning.

Laye nee Spitzer Helen second wife of Ludwig Laye.

Laye Ludwig husband of Helen Spitzer.

Schweigert twins of Emmanuel Schweigert.

Wacker John born May 17, 1869, died from the flu December 23, 1918, married Mary Gutschmidt born October 16, 1875, died March 07, 1957, at Falum, Alberta.

Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church and Cemetery Hatton, Saskatchewan.

NE 35-12-29-W3.

Property for this cemetery was donated by the Gottfried Werre family.

The German Evangelical Krimmerfeld Congregation of Forres, Saskatchewan, was organized November 28, 1912, and affiliated with the Joint Synod of Missouri.

Reverend Griesse from Medicine Hat, Alberta, traveled to the area to conduct services. The church measuring twenty by forty feet was built in 1912, it seated sixty members. Reverend W.L. Kohn was the first

resident Pastor, he lived in two ten foot by ten foot rooms attached to the back of the church. A parsonage was constructed in 1916.

Reverend Kohn served until February 1914, he was replaced by Reverend A. Krug. Other pastors were: William Lohmann, E.H. Behrends, C.A. Kramer and L.S. Laufer who served until 1927.

The first minister, from Hatton, Saskatchewan, William A. Busse served from 1927 to 1935. Reverend Busse served eight other stations as well, namely Many Island Lake, Buffalo Head (Horsham), Neuheim, Walsh, Downey's Lake (Arbana), Sagathun, Golden Prairie and Hilda. There followed a six year period when the congregation was without a pastor until Reverend Walter A. Brockupp served from 1941 to 1946. He was followed by Reverend C. Witte, who served until 1948, when the congregation joined with a larger unit at Maple Creek, Saskatchewan. Eventually, in 1950, both church and parsonage were moved into Maple Creek.

A note of interest; in 1937, according to the minutes, Grace Church paid the vacancy pastor one dollar per service.

As at April 08, 1997, this cemetery located just south of the CPR mainline tracks at the west Hatton crossing is well fenced, grass has not been cut in ages, a path was cut from the gate to the small enclosure where the Nimz and Knipp family members are interred. There are several cave ins where I assume graves are located, there are numerous holes dug by badgers.

The following information was taken from the markers:

Small marker with initials E.A.K. K probably stands for Knipp.

Knipp nee Nimz Elizabeth Alice born 1896, drowned in Bitter Lake 1921. "Beloved wife of Theo W. Knipp."

Two other small metal markers but no visible dates. These two markers could be a Knipp daughter who married a

Mr. Schlag and her infant daughter. As per phone call from Louis Seifert April 12, 1997.

Nimz Robert Otto born 1897, died 1979, "Rest in peace."

Nimz Bertha born 1866, died 1930, "In loving memory of our mother."

The above six graves are inside a well-kept fence consisting of page wire on wood and metal posts painted white.

Busse imprinted on two foot high concrete cross. Child of Pastor William and Gertrude Busse.

Childs grave covered with concrete, information eroded to point where it is illegible.

Heine John born October 07, 1905, died accidently November 04, 1932, inside wrought iron fence, husband of Rose nee Maves.

Heine Gottlieb born March 23, 1877, at Tarutina, Russia, died October 24, 1931, inside wrought iron fence, husband of Maria Sept.

Schuler Anna born May 14, 1891, died June 14, 1929, inside wood fence. "A loving mother true and kind."

Daughter of Gottlieb and Anna Schuler.

Gnamm Christoph born February 15, 1860, in Russia, died January 29, 1919, husband of Margrata Gnamm.

Gnamm Margrata born March 20, 1863, died December 16, 1918, wife of Christoph Gnamm. They have one marker along west fence line.

Metal fence with page wire, no marker.

Goetz "Hier ruht in frieden sonnlien von Paul and Anna Goetz" born February 20, 1906, died May 04, 1916.

Metal marker, grave has wood frame, no data.

Borthlohn born 1881, died 1934.

Pfaff Gottlieb born 1860, died 1941, husband of Katherine Siegle.

Pfaff nee Siegle Katherine born 1873, died July 1942, at Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, second wife of Gottlieb Pfaff.

They have one grave marker.

Moch Valtin born 1869, died 1935, husband of Rosina Moch.

Moch Rosina born 1879, died 1948, wife of Valtin Moch.

They have one grave marker inside metal fence

The following information taken from the church records as supplied by Louis Seifert April 10, 1997:

Busse Robert 24 hours, died June 29, 1928, interred June 30, 1928, cause of death gout (Giehter), of Pastor W.A. and Mrs. Busse, brother of Norman, Thelma and Donald.

Drockner Russel died January 31, 1942.

Fass Rosina Barbara 55 years, 3 months, 17 days, died March 19, 1914, interred March 23, 1914, cause of death; haemorrhage (Blutsturz), wife of Friedrich Faas, mother of Friedrich Jr., Elizabeth, Johann, Rosine, Katharina and Bertha.

Fischer Friedrich 31 years, 5 months, 8 days, died January 11, 1922, interred January 15, 1922, cause of death; alcohol poisoning, husband of Magdalena Rohrbach, father of three children.

Goetz Alfred 10 years, 2 months, 14 days, died May 04, 1916, interred May 07, 1916, cause of death; pneumonia (Lungenentzündung), of Paul Goetz and Anna Goetz, brother of Albina and Erwin Goetz.

Gnamm Christoph 58 years, 11 months, 15 days, died January 30, 1919, interred January 31, 1919, cause of death Auszehrung, husband of Margaretha Moch. Mourned by ten children.

Gnamm Ella died July 09, 1914, interred July 12, 1914, scalded (Verbrüht), of Christoph Gnamm and Margrta Moch.

Gnamm nee Moch Margaretha died December 16, 1918, interred December 18, 1918, wife of Christoph Gnamm, cause of death heart stroke (Herzschlag).

Grenz Arthur 4 months and 8 days, died August 25, 1914, interred August 26, 1914, cause of death was gout (Gicht), of Johann Grenz.

Gutknecht nee Renner Paulina 57 years, 11 months, 19 days, died December 28, 1923, at Hatton, Saskatchewan, interred January 01, 1924, cause of death pneumonia (Lungenentzündung), wife of Karl Gutknecht.

Halverson Henry 80 years, 8 months, 22 days, died May 08, 1933, interred May 10, 1933, by Reverend Busse, cause of death heart stroke while sleeping at night (Herzschlag in der nacht im schlaf),

Heine Gottlieb born March 1877, at Tarutina, Russia, died October 24, 1931, interred October 27, 1931, by Reverend Busse, cause of death heart illness (Herzleiden), husband of Maria Sept.

Heine John born October 07, 1905, died November 04, 1932, at Walsh, Alberta, interred November 06, 1932, cause of death accidental (Verunglückt im Wald), husband of Rosa Maves, son of Margaretha Heine.

Jahuke Leonard 64 years, 2 months, 29 days, died September 09, 1923, at Medicine Hat, Alberta, interred September 12, 1923, cause of death cancer (Krebs).

Knipp Denice Willette 5 years, 3 months, 19 days, died November 23, 1923, at Mendham, Saskatchewan, interred November 24, 1923, cause of death diphtheria, of Theodore Knipp and Lena Ohlhauser.

Knipp Elizabeth Alice 24 years, 3 months, 7 days, died August 01, 1920, interred August 03, 1920, cause of death drowning (ertrunken) in Bitter Lake, of Richard Nimz and Bertha Jahnker, wife of Theodore Knipp.

Luhning Friedrich Heinrich 21 days, died days, October 20, 1913, interred October 23, 1913, of Friedrich Luhning and Selma Seifert. Cause of death, fever.

Maier Marvin 3 months, 17 days, died December 04, 1922, interred December 05, 1922, cause of death gout (Gicht), of Friedrich Maier and Katharina Ketterling.

Moch Eugena Augustina died July 06, 1925, at Hatton, Saskatchewan, interred July 07, 1925, cause of death gout (Gicht), of Gottlieb Moch and Florentina Traxel.

Moch Jakobina 5 years, 3 months, 29 days, died April 14, 1914, interred April 16, 1914, burned in a stubble fire (Verbrannt), of Valtin Moch and Rosine Schuler.

Moch Valentin.

Nimz Bertha 64 years, 8 months, 2 days, died December 17, 1930, interred December 21, 1930, by Reverend Busse, cause of death cancer (Krebs), wife of Richard Nimz.

Pfaff Gottlieb died September 01, 1941, interred October 03, 1941, cause of death heart illness (Herzleiden), father of eleven children.

Pfaff nee Siegle Katharina died June 30, 1942, interred July 04, 1942.

Ruff Jacob died 1935, husband of Emilie Ruff.

Schmidt unnamed stillborn August 06, 1918, interred August 06, 1918, of Friedrich Schmidt and Beata Zollner.

Schuler nee Betsch Anna born 1891 in Russia, 38 years, 1 month, died June 28, 1929, interred June 30, 1929, by Reverend Busse, cause of death post-partum illness (Kindbett) wife of Gottlieb Schuler.

Sept Edward Leonard 10 months, 16 days, died June 12, 1926, in the Medicine Hat, Alberta, hospital interred June 14, 1926, cause of death pneumonia, of Jacob Sept and Amalia Moch.

Singer Christina 81 years, 4 months, 29 days, died October 23, 1933, at Medicine Hat, Alberta, interred October 25, 1933, by Reverend Busse, cause of death cancer of throat and tongue (Krebs an der zunge and hals), wife of J. Singer.

Vorreiter born July 24, 1884, died June 22, 1918, interred June 23, 1918, found dead, probably died from a heart

attack.

Weisschadel nee Scherer Eva 36 years, 3 months, 3 days, died September 13, 1944, interred September 07, 1944, wife of Chris Weisschadel.

Werre Gottfried Joseph born 1873 in Ireland, 56 years, 3 months, 2 days, died January 27, 1931, interred February 01, 1931, by Reverend Busse, cause of death stroke, husband of Eva Huber.

Wiege Gottlieb 73 years, 2 months, 24 days, died February 23, 1933, at Hatton, Saskatchewan, interred February 26, 1933, by Reverend Busse, cause of death heart stroke, (Herzschlag bei seiner arbeit im stall), husband of Sophia Land. Gottlieb and Sophia married December 17, 1880.

Wiege Henrich 28 years, 10 months, 6 days, died November 13, 1921, in the Maple Creek, Saskatchewan, hospital interred November 13, 1921, cause of death acute nephritis (nierenkrankheit), of Gottlieb and Sophia Wiege, husband of Paulina Katharina Hink, father of Harry and William Wiege

Hatton, Saskatchewan, United Church.

The congregation was probably formed about 1950, they first held services in the school, later in the L.O.O.F. hall or private homes until 1960. Reverend Norman Labrentz served for two years starting in 1960, he conducted services and Sunday School every other week.

Hatton, Saskatchewan, Full Gospel Church.

This small congregation moved a tiny church from Irvine, Alberta, in 1962. Pastors from Medicine Hat, Alberta, traveled out every Sunday until 1974 when the assembly relocated to Maple Creek, Saskatchewan.

Arabana Lutheran Cemetery, Hatton, Saskatchewan.

This site is known by several different names including Zion Lutheran Church, Arabana School and or Downey's Lake. This small fenced cemetery can be located by traveling 6.3 miles south, one mile west and one mile south of the number one highway, turn south just before the railway

overpass east of where Kincorth, Saskatchewan, was situated. The cemetery is on the south side of the Greek Orthodox Cemetery, there are no grave markers, the barbed wire fence is in good condition but vegetation has not been trimmed in many years, as at April 08, 1997. Conversation with Margaret Sandau at Maple Creek, Saskatchewan, on April 07, 1997, indicated that the following are interred here.

Frieke Ernest William died August 21, 1925, buried August 23, 1925, at 5 months, 21 days. Cause of death pneumonia.

Sandau nee Finkbinder Margaret died spring 1933, wife of Adam Sandau.

Sandau Amelia 18 years, of Adam and Margaret Sandau.

Sandau Pearl 5 weeks, of Henry and Elizabeth Sandau.

Schweigert Philipp Jacob 88 years, 10 months, 18 days, died May 03, 1928, buried May 05, 1928.

Schweigert Mrs. died 1931, buried by a sectarian minister, wife of Philipp Schweigert.
