### **Schmidt Family Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

This small cemetery is located just east of a large, flat topped rock pile about one eighth mile north of the gate to the Many Island Grazing pasture on the Archie Daffy property SW 32-14-01- W 4. It is one mile south of township road 150 on range road 15, one mile west and nine miles south of Schuler, Alberta. As at September 04, 1996, the cemetery is outlined with small metal pins, five graves are marked with pins, there are no markers of any kind with information on them. There seem to be about eight graves at this site. Directions to this cemetery were passed on to us by Mr. Traugott Stehr.

Further research September 08, 1996, resulted in the following: This small plot holds the remains of five Schmidt family members some of who perished during the flu epidemic in 1918. The rest of the family moved to unknown points in the United States shortly after the tragedy. Some family members return to this site every few years to ensure all is well.

### **St. Peter's Lutheran Church Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

St. Peter's German Lutheran Church was formed in 1917. A house that was donated to the Lippert brothers was moved to their land and converted into a church. Reverend John Oberlander from Irvine, Alberta, was the first pastor to conduct services.

This cemetery is located five miles west and five miles south of Schuler, Alberta, on a good gravel grade. The cemetery is on the west side of range road 23, is poorly fenced, overgrown with weeds and several graves are caved in as at August 30, 1996. Legal land description is SE 21-15-02- W 4. Size of plot about 25 feet east/west and 100 feet north/south.

There are about nine graves in the fenced area, only one has a marker, the other information was taken from the Schuler, Alberta, history book.

### **Congregational Matthais Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

All the small churches were spearheaded by men and women of convictions and here five miles west and three miles south of Schuler, Alberta, history was repeating itself. In 1918 Frederick Jacober and Jacob Martz led the way and established one more place to worship that was close to the pioneers homes. Mr. Jacob Martz donated the one acre needed to build the church. The first pastor at this church was Reverend Krieger. This cemetery is located five miles west and three miles south of Schuler, Alberta, on east side of range road 23, a good graveled grade. Legal land description is SW 34-15-02-W4. Grass in cemetery has not been cut in a long time, fence is in good shape. Size of plot about one acre. As at August 30, 1996.

Church records indicate that 36 burials took place here, there are only four graves with markers, three have legible data.

### **Peace Lutheran Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

The Good Hope Lutheran Congregation was organized twelve miles southeast of Schuler, Alberta, in the Forres, Saskatchewan, area. Forres was later renamed Hatton. This congregation was first served by Reverend Spohr in 1910. The first services were conducted in private homes.

In 1912 a small wood frame church was built. The building committee consisted of August Beck, Martin Frasch, Paul Getz, John Adam and George Hagel.

In 1918 this church proved inadequate and a larger church was built under the direction of William Beck, Carl Ensminger, Mike Bauer and Gottlieb Adam. The small church was later sold to the village of Schuler, Alberta, where it was used as a school. The school population soon outgrew this small building so it was sold to Frank Wetsch who remodeled it into a home. It was owned later by Martin Volk.

The new church was moved into Schuler, Alberta, in 1955. The Peace Lutheran Congregation of Schuler and the Good Hope Congregation united under the name Good Hope. New Kronsfelt and Good Hope were served by one pastor since 1918. In 1940, the Bethlehem Congregation of Hilda, Alberta, joined the parish and now they were known as the Schuler Lutheran Parish.

The first parsonage was built in 1918 at the former rural Good Hope site. In 1935, this home was moved into Schuler, Alberta. A new parsonage was built in 1964, under the direction of Henry Nitschke, Melvin Haskell, Rueben Ehret, Clifford Elle, Fred Hartman and Ernest Elle.

The church is located near the west entrance to Schuler, Alberta, on north side of street. Legal land description is SW 16-16-01- W 4. Cemetery is well fenced, very clean, with all markers in upright position.

### **Norwegian Lutheran Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

This group of Norwegian Lutherans held their services in the rural Industry and Melba schools, their pastors would come from Medicine Hat, Alberta. Some of the members were: Charles Rollefstad, Sigrid Hanson, Nels Olsen, Hilmer Rollefstad and Felix Arlington.

Some of the pastors were: Mickleson, Branser, Walker, Arneson and Norstad. The records for this cemetery have been misplaced. The plot of land for the cemetery was donated by Charlie Nordin.

The plot is located two miles west, two miles south and one half mile east of Schuler, Alberta, on the north side of township road 160. Legal land description SE 06-15-01- W 4. This is about a four acre plot, enclosed with a tall carrigana hedge and a broken down fence, the grass has not been cut in years. There are a few legible markers in one corner, one must look closely to find them. The community has erected a stone monument listing all those interred here, but only lists year of death. This monument is surrounded with a steel pipe fence to keep cattle from rubbing on it. This cemetery is known by some as the "Government Cemetery" as it was supposedly used to inter folks who did not belong to any religious denomination.

### **Church of God Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

The first gathering of the church was a tent meeting held in the Knoblich school district in 1930. Services were held in that school and later at Melba School as well. Services were conducted by pastors from Medicine Hat, Alberta. Some of the pastors that served were Reverend Boes, Reverend J. Wiens, Reverend C. Buteriet and Mr. and Mrs. H.G. Babel.

After several years of holding regular services in the schools, a building was moved from the Beacon Hill school district. This thirty five mile move was made with a team of twenty eight horses.

Pastors at the new church included S. Jans, J. Hoffman and William Rabel. At times Bible school students Dave and Vi Settle and Stan Hoffman conducted the services.

A new parsonage was built in the hamlet of Schuler, Alberta, in 1956 and a new church was built there as well in 1960, the old church building was moved from the property in 1960.

This cemetery is located five miles west of Schuler, Alberta, at the crossroads of range road 23 and township road 162. The cemetery is now a small 8 foot by 12 foot fenced parcel some 100 yards north of township road 162. The cemetery record is with Wilbur and Evelyn Boettcher at Schuler, Alberta. Legal land description is SW 15-16-02- W 4. As at August 30, 1996. Only one burial took place at this location.

### **St. Joseph's Parish Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

Early Catholic families practiced their faith when Priests would make a traveling circuit throughout the scattered settlements. The first Mass in the Schuler district was celebrated in the Emmanuel Hagel home in 1911 by Father F.X. Erme. The early Priests were able to travel the rails free in deference to Father Lacombe's work for the railway.

After the first good crop, the pioneers took a collection and built a church on the Tony Zahn property. The land for the cemetery across the road was donated by Adam N eigel. The church was built in 1917 without the bishop's help or knowledge.

Mass was said only once per month. The church was used every Sunday for teaching catechism and for prayers and Rosary for the entire congregation.

The church was named at the suggestion of a traveling missionary.

The hamlet of Schuler was built one mile west of the church in 1923. In 1930 a new church under the auspices of Bishop Kidd, was erected with mostly volunteer help. The old church was converted into use as the rectory. The new church was blessed August 31, 1930, and has since been enlarged.

St. Joseph's can boast of having had the present bishop of Calgary, Alberta, as their parish priest for seven

years. The hamlet has also produced Father Leo Hagel (a Benedictine), also two diocesan priests, Father John Weisgerber and Father Leonard Hagel. Four girls; Frances Wetsch, Veronica Schafer, Victoria Hagel and Virginia Hagel entered the religious life.

The first recorded baptisms were Katherine Wetsch in 1911 and Anthony Zahn in 1912. The first to be baptized in the new church was Frances Hagel in 1930. The first two marriages in the new church were between Louis Grossman and Rosie Hagel and between Anthony Schafer and Eugenia Aberle.

The cemetery is located about one mile east of Schuler, Alberta, on the north side of township road 162 and east of range road 13. The legal land description is SW 15-16-01-W4. Two new monuments have been erected recently, one lists donors for the improvement project, the other shows an incomplete list of interments. The monument shows only the age of deceased at death rather than birth or death dates. An attempt was made to place a durable, white metal cross at each grave, but some burial sites are not known. This location has been inactive since 1956.

### **Freidensfelt Baptist Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

The piece of property for this church and cemetery was donated by Mr. August Reich. The Freidensfelt Baptist Church was a mission station of Hilda, Alberta. Early in 1917 John Herrmann Sr. and Jacob Will Sr.

organized a group in the area and went ahead with the construction of a church. Up to this time worship services were held on a rotating basis in the homes, and later in the Fredensfelt school. The name for the district was suggested by Mrs. Jacob (Caroline) Will.

The first board of directors consisted of John Herrmann Sr., Jacob Will Sr., Jacob Schafer, August Reich, Carl Herrmann, Fred Ulrich, Carl Dickhaut Sr., Jacob Will Jr., and Carl Dickhaut Jr. All labor for construction was volunteered.

The first pastor to serve this new congregation was Reverend E.P. Wahl. Other pastors who served Freidensfelt were: Reverends Matz, Paefinier and Feisel.

This group like others were extremely active, the community seemed to revolve around the church. A talented young settler, Julius Littke, organized a brass band and played at church functions.

The church was sold and moved from this location, today all that remains is another neglected cemetery.

The cemetery is located on a desolate hilltop just north of SH 528 and just west of range road 21, two miles west, six miles south and one and one half miles west of Schuler, Alberta. The legal land description is SE 14-15-02- W 4. The one acre property is surrounded by a good fence, sage brush and other native grasses have not been cut in some years. As at August 31, 1996.

### **Quast Family Cemetery, Schuler, Alberta.**

This small fenced cemetery sits on a hillside very near the roads edge at the junction of range road 23 and township road 160, five miles west and two miles south of Schuler, Alberta. Legal land description is NE

33-15-02-W4. As at August 30, 1996, there is one grave here, grass uncut for many years the fence is in good condition.

Information received from Tom Quast September 24, 1996, indicates that the infant child of August Quast and Martha Schuh is interred here. Tom is a nephew to August.

This lonely, forgotten, unkempt cemetery is located three and one half miles east one half mile south and about 200 yards west of Schuler, Alberta, on the Alberta/Saskatchewan border. Someone has removed the fence and discarded the wire near the two remaining markers, again the grass has not been cut in years. The graves are only 200 yards on the Alberta side. The legal land description is SE 12-16-01-W4.

Schilling Emma born June 29, 1912, died April 29, 1917, of John Schilling.

Schilling Frederich born June 30, 1916, died October 26, 1916, on same marker as Emma Schilling.

Christman Andrew born September 10, 1879, died December 13, 1916, first husband of Christina Ehrman, she married Henry Christman, Andrew's brother, after his death.

### **NW 13-15-02-W4, Will Family Cemetery.**

The Schuler, Alberta, history book states that Jacob Will's mother and four of her infant grandchildren are interred in a small plot along the west side of this property. The cemetery is located on range road 11 and one mile north of township road 152. We visited the site September 08, 1996, and could not find any sign of a burial plot. There is a small grove of shrubs near the north-west corner and suspect the burials might have occurred there.

As at October 18, 1997, we believe the following are also interred here:

Will Edith died November 25, 1919, of Jake Will.

Will Elenor H. died March 15, 1928, of John Will.
