

Tothill

Lutheran Church and Cemetery, Tothill, Alberta.

Services were first conducted in pioneers horne until the church in this area could be built in 1914. The church was closed about 1947 due to the shrinking rural population. The building has long since been removed from this site.

Some of the pastors who served here were: Arnsdorf, Scheffler, Mantz, and Doering.

This cemetery can be found by traveling south on the Eagle Butte Road, three miles east on township road 94 then two miles south on range road 43. The property is in the south-east comer of SE 16-09-04-W4 at the junction of township road 92 and range road 43. The cemetery plot is on the west side of what was probably a four acre yard, is fenced with three strands of barbed wire. The grass was waist deep September 06, 1996. We were able to find six stone markers, two of which are broken.

As found on markers:

Rath Jacob born July 03, 1909, died September 15, 1915.

Rath John born February 02, 1887, died July 02, 1917.

Schneider Fred born May 27, 1893, died November 08, 1916, husband of Elizabeth Schneider.

Schneider Elizabeth born 1864, died 1919, wife of Fred Schneider.

Stuber Andrew born 1862, died 1915, husband of Katherine Stuber.

Stuber Henry born December 23, 1913, died accidently August 04, 1935, in an accident with a horse of Adam and Elizabeth Stuber.

As found on markers:

Rath Willard J. born February 06, 1935, died November 01, 1935, of John Rath and Mary Stuber.

Schneider Edward, son of Fred and Elizabeth Schneider.
