Special Evangelistic services were first held in 1944, the church became an official charge of the Northwest Canada Conference held at Didsbury, Alberta, in 1944. Reverend E.W. Riegel, living at Mendham, Saskatchewan, was the first pastor to serve the Leader church.

The congregation purchased a lot in Leader on March 08, 1946, and moved the parsonage from Mendham. This building had at one time been a church at Estuary, Saskatchewan, was moved to Mendham, converted into a parsonage and would now become a church again. Dedication services conducted by District Superintendent Dr. W.W. Kruger were held October 27, 1947. In 1967, the building was moved onto a new basement, enlarged to include Sunday School class rooms and modern utilities were installed.
